- Personality Dimensions/True Colors

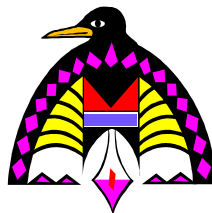

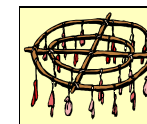
## Vocational Sponsorship

Assistance is available for eligible CDD clients who are pursuing qualified and recognized training in a vocational training program that provides an average or above average occupational outlook.

### The program must be:

- 12 months or less in duration
- at a PCTIA approved Institute
- a certificate program

Upon completion of the program the client must be able to secure immediate employment in their acquired field of skills training.



### To apply for funding assistance:

- Must be of proven Aboriginal descent—First Nation—status/non status or Inuit
- Must reside within the Stó:lō Territory for a minimum of 12 consecutive months
- Meet with a CDD Career Practitioner to review career training goals
- Participate and successfully complete a recognized Career Assessment Program
- Secure referral to Training Consultant to complete application form
