Kee Lang graduated from the United Kingdom Nursing Program in 1976, and subsequently, from the Midwifery Program in 1979. Since graduation, she has worked in England before securing a nursing position in Canada, with a brief work experience in Malaysia. Starting out in New Brunswick, she then moved to Ontario before settling in BC. Her work experience encompasses Acute Medicine, Obstetrics, Neurosurgery Intensive Care, Acute Rehab Medicine, Long Term Care and Community Nursing. Between 1995 and 1997, she lived on the reserve of Klemtu, where she successfully proposed, and was granted funding by INAC to initiate the Home Support Worker's Program (currently known as the RCA program), in which she assumed the role of the Nurse Instructor. Living in Klemtu also allowed her the opportunity to deliver classroom teachings to Grades 1 to 12, in Health Sciences. In BC, she was employed at the University, Vancouver General, Royal Columbia and Surrey Memorial hospitals, and with experiences derived from teaching hospitals in acute medicine, she is very passionate about applying that knowledge in a community setting, in supporting and teaching the chronically ill.
